NATIONAL

- The Supreme Court has directed state governments to fix a reasonable charge for providing ambulance services to COVID-19 patients.
- Metro operations will start at 6:00 AM on all sections on Sunday, September 13, Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) said .
- A student's marksheet has become a "prestige sheet" for the family, and a "pressure sheet" for the child, said PM Narendra Modi . "Parents today don't ask their children what they have learned in school.
- The National Testing Agency (NTA) has declared the results for the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) Main 2020 today. 24 students have scored 100 percentile, the NTA said.
- Union Minister of State for Railways Suresh Angadi on Friday announced that he has tested positive for coronavirus.
- Social activist and Arya Samaj leader Swami Agnivesh passed away at the age of 80 after a multi-organ failure. He was suffering from liver cirrhosis and was admitted to the Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences in Delhi.
- A 28-year-old businessman, who allegedly hit a cyclist with his Range Rover on Badarpur flyover and left him at a Delhi hospital, has been arrested by the police.
- Former Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis on Friday accused Shiv Sena of 'blowing out of proportion' the issue involving actor Kangana Ranaut.
- Three men, wearing face masks, robbed a jewellery shop of valuables and cash worth around ₹36.5 lakh at gunpoint in Uttar Pradesh's Aligarh.
- Cheruthuruthy policemen in Kerala's Thrissur district are growing vegetables on vehicles confiscated by them after they piled up around the compound of the police station.
- Bangalore International Airport Limited (BIAL) on Friday announced the opening of a warehousing facility covering an area of 10,000 square feet.
- Madhya Pradesh Minister Vijay Shah asked a man, who had sought help to set up a barber shop, to give him a haircut on stage at a function in order to demonstrate his skill.
- Hoteliers in Pune have said that the government hasn't paid any compensation to hotels that were "forcefully requisitioned" to quarantine COVID-19 medical staff and patients in April.
- South Western Railway announce that the platform ticket price at three Bengaluru stations will be increased from ₹10 to ₹50 to avoid crowd amid the coronavirus pandemic.
- Private security agencies in Gautam Buddha Nagar must be verified and character certification of their personnel is mandatory, police said.





- Four drug peddlers have been arrested from a farmhouse in Kalaburagi district, and 1350.3 kg of marijuana was also seized from them, Bengaluru City Police said.

INTERNATIONAL

- US President Donald Trump's daughter Ivanka Trump has said she would make an appearance on 'The View' talk show and receive a coronavirus vaccine on-air.
- AstraZeneca's pause of an experimental vaccine for coronavirus after the illness of a participant is a "wake-up call" but shouldn't discourage researchers, WHO chief scientist Soumya Swaminathan said.
- Calling coronavirus the "number one global security threat", UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said, "Either we stand together or we will be doomed."
- Researchers from US published images of the infectious form of SARS-CoV-2, virus that causes COVID-19.
- North Korean authorities have issued shoot-to-kill orders to prevent coronavirus entering the country from China, General Robert Abrams, Commander, United States Forces-Korea, said.
- During a meeting between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi, both the countries agreed that the current situation in border areas is not in interest of either side.
- A Slovenian woman was jailed for two years for deliberately cutting off her hand with a saw to make a fraudulent insurance claim.
- A 56-year-old Brazilian expert on Amazon tribes was killed by an arrow that struck him in his chest as he approached an uncontacted indigenous group he was seeking to protect.
- Britain has secured its first major post-Brexit free trade deal with Japan worth an estimated £15 billion, the International Trade Secretary Liz Truss has announced.
- US President Donald Trump has said he won't be extending the September 20 deadline set for ByteDance to sell TikTok's US operations. "We'll see what happens."
- A series of explosions occurred at a Jordanian military ammunitions depot in Zarqa on Friday, the government said.
- Russia has said that the police have traced opposition leader Alexey Navalny's movements and what he drank before falling ill in Siberia last month.
- Mitsui OSK Lines, Japanese operator of a ship that leaked oil off the Mauritius coast, has pledged to spend about \$9.42 million to help restore the affected areas.
