NATIONAL

- India has reported 39,361 new COVID-19 cases and 416 deaths in the last 24 hours, according to the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.
- Delhi Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) allowed Delhi Metro to run at 100% capacity, 16 additional entry gates of Delhi Metro stations will be made operational from Monday.
- GST Intelligence officials have arrested a Delhi-based businessman for allegedly fraudulently passing on input tax credit (ITC) worth ₹128 crore, an official said.
- PM Narendra Modi on Monday paid tributes to the martyrs of the Kargil War, which India fought with Pakistan in 1999 and won.
- Uttar Pradesh CM Yogi Adityanath on Saturday said 16 districts without any medical colleges will get new colleges through the PPP model in the next six months.
- Himachal Pradesh CM Jairam Thakur on Sunday announced an ex-gratia of ₹4 lakh for families of those who died in landslide incident in Kinnaur, Himachal Pradesh.
- The Goa government on Sunday extended the coronavirus-induced curfew in the state till 7 am on August 2.
- The five new cyber police stations that were inaugurated by Mumbai Police in January this year have recovered ₹58.97 lakh out of the ₹84.39 lakh lost to cyber fraudsters in 36 cases till June
- Maharashtra Chief Minister's Office on Sunday said that 149 people have so far been reported killed in the state due to floods and landslides.
- BJP President JP Nadda on Sunday said that Goa CM Pramod Sawant will continue to be the face for the Goa Assembly elections, which are scheduled for next year.
- An earthquake of magnitude 4.0 occurred around 5 am on Monday at 156 kms South of Hyderabad in Andhra Pradesh, the National Center for Seismology (NCS) said.
- Amid heavy rains in the state, Maharashtra CM Uddhav Thackeray on Sunday said a separate force like the NDRF will be set up in all districts.
- Kerala recorded 17,466 new COVID-19 cases on Sunday, informed a press release issued by the state health department.
