- India has reported 36,401 new COVID-19 cases and 530 deaths in the last 24 hours.
- PM Narendra Modi will on Friday inaugurate and lay the foundation stone for several projects, including the Somnath Promenade, in Gujarat's Somnath through video conferencing.
- Four Indian teachers in Afghanistan's Kabul have appealed for immediate evacuation so they can return to their families back home.
- Uttar Pradesh government has decided to reopen schools for students of Classes 6 to 8 from August 23 and Classes 1 to 5 from September 1.
- The COVID-19 vaccination drive will remain suspended on August 19 and 20 at all government and civic body-run centres in Mumbai due to a shortage of doses, the BMC has announced.
- Bengaluru Police Commissioner Kamal Pant has announced that prohibitory orders issued under Section 144 (1) of Code of Criminal Procedure have been extended till August 30 amid a gradual increase in COVID-19 cases.
- All India Muslim Personal Law Board member Maulana Sajjad Nomani has released a video praising Taliban after it seized control over Afghanistan, saying, "This Hindi Muslim salutes you
- Kerala on Wednesday reported 21,427 new COVID-19 cases, according to the state government's data, taking the infection count to 37,45,457.

- France evacuated 21 Indian nationals on its first evacuation flight from Afghanistan, French ambassador Emmanuel Lenain said.
- At least three people were killed and another 12 were wounded after Taliban gunmen opened fire during protests against the group in Afghanistan's Jalalabad city on Wednesday.
- Over 1,000 people have been killed by security forces in Myanmar since the military coup on February 1, an official of the Assistance Association for Political Prisoners activist group said. "
- Hong Kong police have arrested four members of a university student union for "advocating terrorism" by paying tribute to a person who stabbed a police officer and then killed himself.

- The Supreme Court has issued notice to the Centre over multiple petitions which sought a probe into alleged snooping of journalists, activists and politicians using the Pegasus spyware.

- The Income Tax (I-T) department on Monday raided the Gurugram-based offices of Chinese telecom equipment vendor ZTE. The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) said it is examining alleged bogus claims worth crores to evade taxes.
