- The India Meteorological Department has said Delhi received 94.6 mm rainfall in October so far, the highest in 65 years when 236.2 mm of rain was witnessed in the whole month in 1956.
- The CBSE on Monday clarified regarding a fake date sheet for Classes 10 and 12 term 1 board exams being circulated online.
- Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) today released the date sheets for Class 10 and 12 term 1 board exams 2021-22.
- Haryana Health Minister Anil Vij on Monday released the findings of the third sero survey conducted in the state with around 36,520 participants including children.
- Karnataka on Monday announced that the schools will be allowed to reopen across the state for the students of Classes 1 to 5 from October 25.
- Punjab CM Charanjit Singh Channi on Monday burnt copies of unpaid electricity bills as a symbol of their waiver.
- Amid heavy rain in Uttarakhand for the second consecutive day on Monday, the Char Dham Devasthanam Management Board has temporarily halted the yatra.
- A UP-based firm has said it created non-lethal weapons for Indian forces' use against the Chinese forces at the Line of Actual Control (LAC).
- The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) has identified 404 structurally weak buildings in the city.
- A fourth case has been filed against KP Gosavi, who's a witness for NCB in the drugs bust case in which Aryan Khan was arrested.
- Police cases were filed in MP's Bhopal after a woman hit her husband and another woman in a gym, suspecting an affair between the two, police said.
- A 14-year-old girl in Odisha was allegedly abducted and gang-raped by two men for three consecutive days. In the FIR, the rape survivor stated that she was abducted by the accused in a car when she went to relieve herself on a ground near her house.



- Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in an interview in New York talked about India's economic recovery and said, "The challenge I will face, and the teams are also watching in the ministry, is the way the fuel prices are leading to a big crest."
- The RBI has imposed a monetary penalty of ₹1.95 crore on Standard Chartered Bank for non-compliance with directions.
- New aircraft parts worth more than ₹10 lakh and non-aircraft parts worth over ₹5 lakh will now be procured only after the approval of either Director Finance or Executive Director Finance, Air India said.

INTERNATIONAL

- Foxconn, the Taiwanese company that makes Apple's iPhones, unveiled its first three electric vehicle prototypes. It unveiled an SUV named Model C, a sedan named Model E and a bus named Model T.
- Zerodha and Groww on Monday morning warned investors of a possible issue with the sale of stocks due to an issue with the Central Depository Services (India) Limited (CDSL)
- After an ISKCON temple and devotees were attacked by a mob in Bangladesh, ISKCON issued a statement urging the Bangladesh government to take swift action to "bring an end to violence against minorities" and provide them security.
- China tested a nuclear-capable hypersonic missile in August that circled the globe before speeding towards its target, Financial Times reported citing five sources.
- Pakistan's National Transmission and Despatch Company has blacklisted a Chinese company and barred it from participating in all tenders and bidding processes for a month, Pakistani newspaper Dawn reported.
- Houthi rebels on Sunday said that it has seized new territory in the energy-rich Yemeni provinces of Shabwa and Marib. Shabwa has several oil fields and Yemen's sole liquefied natural gas terminal, while Marib has the country's biggest gas fields.
- The son of a former adviser to former Somali PM has been arrested by the UK police under anti-terrorism laws in connection to the killing of MP David Amess, according to media reports.
- 4000 people were booked after clashes broke out between the police and people demonstrating in Bangladesh's Dhaka against the alleged desecration of the Quran in Cumilla, officials said.
